A: Clinical Support Services

The capability level of these support services are linked to the acuity of the patient and the number of acutely ill patients admitted to the facility. Turn-round time for these services is usually measured in hours rather than minutes therefore the opening hours and location of these services is usually a business management decision.

For all services appropriate access to information, records and results of interventions is critical. The service specified is assumed to be on-site unless specified otherwise.

The services included in this section are:

- A1 Pathology
- A2 Pharmacy
- A3 Diagnostic Imaging (excluding interventional radiology)

B1 ANAESTHETIC SERVICES

In describing anaesthetic service provision the Queensland Health "Clinical Services Capability Framework v3.1 2013" has been adopted. This is a matrix of the physical status of the patient adopted from the American Society ASA (American Society of Anesthesiologists) Scale and surgical complexity and is known as the Anaesthetic Service Capability Matrix.

C: Emergency Medicine Services

Emergency services are key entry points into acute care working at the interface between the community, general practice and hospitals. While closely related to the role of the hospital or service in which it functions this aspect of the model describes the function of the Emergency Department and the responsibilities of Emergency Medicine as a discrete service.

The framework has been adapted from the Australasian College of Emergency Medicine, Statement on Emergency Department Role Delineation², as well as the NSW Role Delineation Model³, the Queensland Clinical Services Capability Model⁴ and the "Roadside to Bedside"⁵ Report.

Emergency Medicine is a field of practice based on the knowledge and skills required for the prevention diagnosis and management of acute and urgent aspects of illness and injury affecting patients of all age groups with a full spectrum of undifferentiated physical and behavioural disorders.⁶

E: Oncology & Haematology Services

Oncology is the branch of medicine that manages the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cancers. Clinical Haematology is the branch of medicine that manages disorders of the blood including leukemia and lymphoma. The NZ Cancer Control Strategy published in 2003 outlines the commitment of the NZ Government to achieve two key things:

- reduce the incidence and impact of cancer
- reduce inequalities with respect to cancer

The development of a more planned approach to the management of Cancer Services including the development of Cancer Networks across New Zealand has influenced the decision to deliberately separate cancer services from medicine and surgery. This is also consistent with the Queensland Health Clinical Services Capability Framework⁷.

The framework has been adapted from the NSW Role Delineation Model⁸, the Queensland Clinical Services Capability Model and has considered the "The NZ Cancer Control Strategy⁹".

This grouping includes:

- E1 Medical Oncology
- E2 Radiation Oncology
- E3 Clinical Haematology

G: Maternity & Neonatal Services

Maternity services aim to achieve a balance between local access to services and the safe provision of care for both mother and baby. This role delineation model covers the spectrum of emergency care for community based lead maternity care to complex obstetrician led care.

Neonatal resuscitation, stabilisation and examination skills are essential in all maternity services. Neonatal care is an integral component of general paediatrics services. The provision of care by neonatal paediatric specialists occurs only at the most complex levels of care. All units may be involved in the stabilisation of unexpectedly sick babies before they can reach the appropriate level of care. This model is assessing the planned level of care only, not the exceptions.

The framework has been adapted from the NSW Role Delineation Model¹⁰, the Queensland Clinical Services Capability Model¹¹ and has considered "A Review of Neonatal Intensive Care Provision in New Zealand" Report¹².

H: Paediatric Specialty Services (Child Health)

The range of Child Health services provided to communities through District Health Boards is extensive. This model is seeking to delineate core services and focuses on paediatric specialty services.

The extent and focus of these services was extensively explored in the report; "Through the Eyes of a Child, A National Review of Paediatric Specialty Services¹⁴". With its overarching principle that children and young people in New Zealand will have their needs treated as paramount, the review focused on nine subsequent principles which would underlie its recommendations.

- child and family focused;
- as close to home as possible within the bounds of quality and safety;
- provided to achieve equity of outcome;
- based on international best practice, research and education;
- monitored and evaluated regularly;
- integrated with other health services;
- culturally safe; and
- fiscally responsible.

This framework has been adapted from the NSW Role Delineation Model¹⁵, the Queensland Clinical Services Capability Model¹⁶ and has considered the "Through the Eyes of a Child" report. The number of sub-specialties that should be recognized has been considered using this report. The range of sub-specialties continues to develop in paediatrics and the services modelled are those that provide 24 hour acute care for children. They framework assumes critical co-locations

In the development of this model it was identified that Older Adults needed a separate categorisation to recognise the intent of the "Health of Older People Strategy" and to enable the model to more effectively reflect the distribution of services within DHB's, regions and nationally.
